

WALKER RIVER PAIUTE TRIBE & WRPT EDUCATION DEPARTMENT STUDENT RECOGNITION POLICY

PURPOSE:

The student recognition policy is to recognize educational achievements of the students residing within the reservation boundaries of the Walker River Paiute Tribe.

The purpose of this policy is to set forth procedures and requirements to administer the rewards and recognition of our youth.

ELIGIBILITY:

1. Must reside within the reservation boundaries of the Walker River Paiute Reservation.
2. Must be an elementary, junior high or high school student.
3. Must attend school in Lyon, Mineral or Churchill County.

RECOGNITION:

- a. Honor Roll
- b. Outstanding Academic Achievement (recommendation by the school or teacher)
- c. Most Improved Student (recommendation by the school or teacher)
- d. Attitude and Enthusiasm to Learning (recommendation by school or teacher)
- e. Perfect Attendance
- f. High School graduation

REWARD:

1. Nine week grading periods = certificate to be awarded at a tribal council meeting.
2. Semester = certificate to be awarded at a tribal council meeting.
3. School year = Dependent on funding available, i.e., t-shirt, sweatshirt, backpack, trophy, certificate, etc.
4. High School graduate = Tribal members only will receive a scholarship for \$500 to be awarded at the schools' awards night and redeemable upon admission into an institute of higher learning.
